Sin causes real consequences, and God will never leave us to face those consequences alone. Today's first reading harkens back to the very beginning when the man and the woman eat from the forbidden tree. They disobey God. The scene depicts two people hungry for more and better. The first people want to become gods themselves. The serpent lures the man and the woman in by promising to give them what they think they want. The serpent tries to create distance between the people and God, yet God does not allow that to happen.

The sins of the man and the woman hurt their relationship with God. They face severe consequences for what they have done. Still, God does not end the relationship with the man and the woman. In one of the more powerful biblical scenes, God is described as walking around the garden in search of the couple. God values both justice and mercy. Sin is not without consequences, and the people who sin remain beloved children of God.

In today's gospel, Jesus goes against the religious authorities of the time. Jesus recognizes that while the scribes hold influence within the community, they are corrupt and are not leading the people in ways God intends. In response Jesus offers two parables to the scribes that call for liberation from sin and division. He shows that even those claiming to be religious authorities can be corrupt. This continues to be true in our times.

Everyday Stewardship

I have coached all three of my children in soccer at some time in their lives. I loved teaching them and their teammates the importance of functioning as one unit. If we were not all moving together toward victory, we would all find ourselves together in defeat. We used to go through one drill I called the "human foosball." We would scrimmage with players in lines like on a foosball table. If you ever got too far behind or too far ahead of those in your line, play would stop and the ball would go to the other team. The goal was to help build an awareness of where your teammates were on the pitch and to teach the lesson that no one player is a team onto themselves.

As disciples and stewards, we sometimes find ourselves far behind or maybe even too far ahead. As a consequence, our actions either hinder the ability of the Body of Christ to evangelize and pass on the faith to a new generation or present the Church as an entity that sees itself as judgmental or too holy to be in the world. We are called to community, and in that community, we must be aware of our brothers and sisters in the faith. At times, we need to help them grow in their faith. Other times, we need to slow down and realize that we cannot change the world on our own. We all have unique gifts we are called to share, and we can only bear true witness to the power of the Body of Christ when we are all moving together and making each other strong.

Trenching for new pipes and drains.

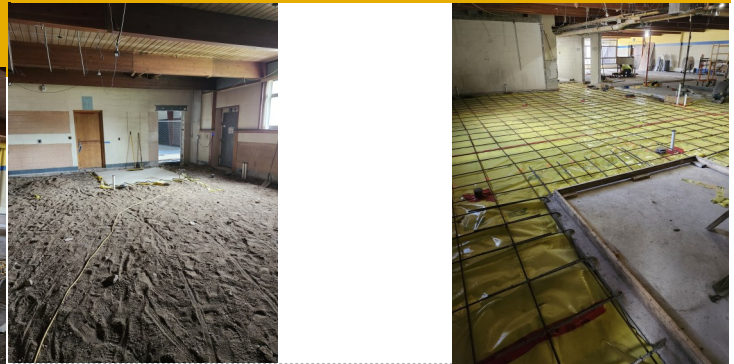

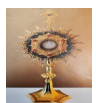
Adoration Moments

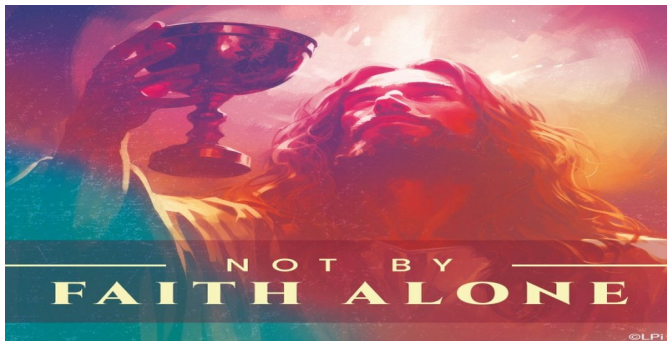

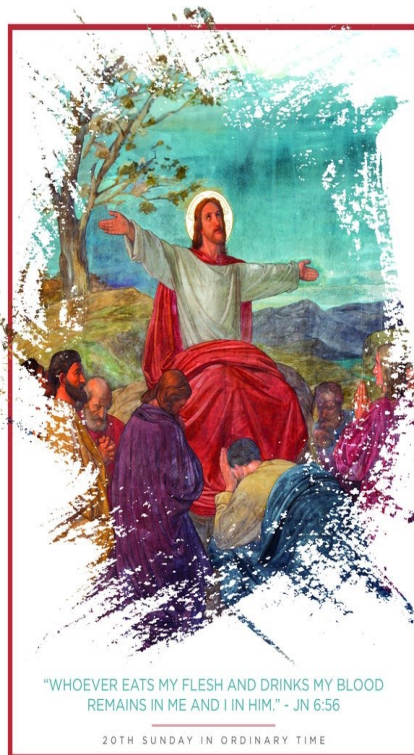
