Jesus sent the disciples out in pairs. This decision highlights the deeply communal nature of discipleship. We are not made to share the good news alone. To a world that values a “me first” mentality, Jesus says go out together. Lean on one another. The Son of God continues to call Christians to team up with each other in ministry. Who are your disciple partners? Who else from our congregation or neighborhood might be a valued partner for doing Christ’s work?

Jesus instructs the disciples on how to exit a difficult situation with dignity. If a place does not welcome them, the disciples are to leave by simply shaking the dust off their feet on the way out. This traditional Jewish gesture is a gentle yet pointed way to depart. The hostile household receives dirt rather than the word of God. Jesus wants the disciples to be prepared for rejection. Not every person is ready to receive the good news. That does not mean we stop preaching it, but it does require disciples to be discerning about when it is time to pack up and move on.

God calls people to discipleship in the midst of everyday life. In today’s first reading, a shepherd named Amos finds himself pulled from the fields and sent out to prophesy in the name of God. Amos claimed he was no prophet, but God had other plans in mind. We may not be sent to northern Israel, but like Amos, God calls each of us for the work of discipleship exactly where we are. In our homes, workplaces, schools, and communities, we are called to spread God’s message of love to the world. *Living Liturgy, p. 175*

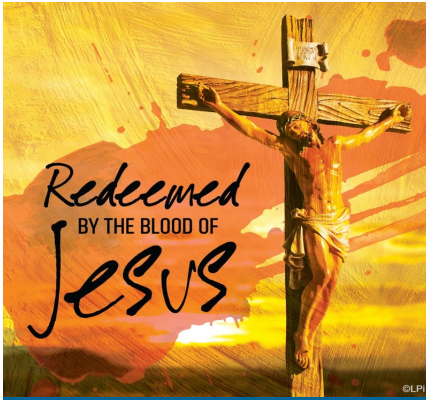
Everyday Stewardship

I recently got into an Uber car for a ride to the airport. I like talking with drivers if I sense they are open to it. On this particular day, the driver was very talkative and told me about how he was an inventor. He had several patents and was about to sell one of his inventions for a ton of money. We had a wonderful conversation, and he was such a warm and interesting person. I asked him why, with his good fortune with inventions and all the work he was doing aside from Uber, he was still driving. He smiled and said, "There are still some people I haven't met yet. I never know who is going to get into my car next."

What an amazing answer! Too often we live our lives in semi-solitude, walking around with blinders on so we don't make eye contact. We have our family and friends, but we don't get up each day wondering with excitement who we will meet that day.

God puts people into our path all the time. Maybe we need them or they need us. But we do not walk through this world alone. If we choose to not be mindful of who is in our midst, we miss the chance to receive whatever gifts they may have to give. In the same vein, they miss out on what we have to share with them if we stay closed and quiet. Pay attention to those around you. God may come to you in the words of a friend, the request of a homeless man, or in the wisdom of an Uber driver.

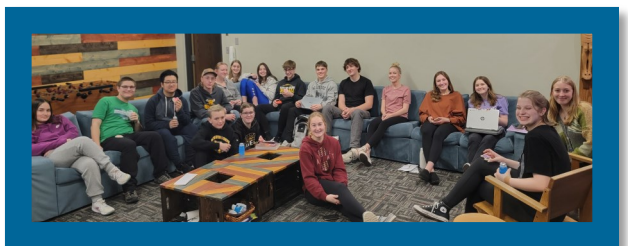
National Eucharistic Revival Prayer
