Today's readings remind us that we are part of one Body and one Spirit. Humankind shares a common call. Thus, we are to care for one another just as we would care for our most cherished loved one. Particularly, biblical stories like today's first reading and gospel emphasize the need to care for people living in poverty. The hungry must be fed. It is the responsibility of those who have enough food to ensure that everyone else has their fill too. Bearing responsibility for each other is a foundational aspect of faith expressed in the old and New Testament.

The story of the feeding of the five thousand is the only miracle account to be written about in all four gospels. John's framing helps readers know a deeper truth about Jesus: that he is the Son of the living God who has come to nourish our every need. The physical feeding of the crowds with five loaves and two fish is significant for sure. But what matters most to John is that people come to know and believe in the miracle-worker.

The people deem Jesus is a prophet upon benefiting from his miraculous feeding, but their understanding of Jesus is still limited to earthly frameworks of leadership. They want to make him a political king, which is not the type of kingship Jesus came to take on. So, the Son of God withdraws to the mountain alone. He takes time for silence and solitude with God to discern his next step.

## ${\tt EVERYDAY\ STEWARDSHIP\ -\ RECOGNIZE\ GOD\ IN\ YOUR\ ORDINARY\ MOMENTS:\ It's\ All\ in\ the\ Basket}$

St. Therese of Lisieux made a point of going the extra mile in kindness towards those people who really got under her skin. It was part of her own brand of Everyday Stewardship — thanking God for all His creation, even the parts with which, in her own humanness, she struggled to cope.

I think about this a lot when I challenge myself to give thanks for things that bother me and people who challenge me. When I do this, I envision Christ giving thanks over those insufficient loaves. How many of us would see that paltry little basket and kick a rock in frustration because we can't feed all our people? "You didn't give me enough, Lord! You didn't give me enough patience, enough money, enough creativity, enough stamina to be a good steward. If you had given me more, I could also give more!"

In those moments of despair, we need to take a good look at the life God has given us. We need to look at the trials and the challenges and the shortcomings. The hopes that didn't pan out, the disappointments that keep cropping up. Somewhere therein lies what we need to be the steward God asks us to be, just as St. Therese's own stewardship was defined by the people she simply couldn't stand. God does not give us all we want. He does not give us all we ask for. He does us one better: He gives us all we need. It's all in the basket.

# **School News**

#### Annual Report to Stakeholders

Let us start by celebrating! We do not do that enough. Despite the challenges, and yes, we recognize many challenges this year, we have used our resources and employees very efficiently. We have had a year of developing and growing our school through the addition of our Middle School program, a new math curriculum and the addition of new teachers in the building. We have continued this growth with the renovation of the kitchen and cafeteria which began in April. We partnered with Hutchinson Public Schools to cater lunches from mid-April to the end of the school year. Our cooks managed all of this quite well. When students return to school after Labor Day they will be welcomed with a bright shiny new kitchen and cafeteria. An area we recognize as opportunity is in our state testing scores. We have to remember that these tests are a snapshot of a student's knowledge and there are so many other things that



play into academics. This year our spring NWEA scores overall showed in math we were in the 70% percentile for achievement, and 42% for growth. Our reading scores showed us in the 74% percentile for achievement and 42% percentile for growth. Our students are high achievers but showing little growth. At a minimum we want to be in the 60% or higher for both categories. A goal for next year will be to increase student's growth, while maintain or growing achievement. One of the items in our strategic plan is the addition of 7th & 8th grades. We started 7th grade this year and will start our 8th grade in the fall. Despite small numbers in this group we were able to model a middle school experience for the kids. They had different teachers for the different subject matters and switched rooms accordingly. We have learned a lot from this middle school addition and will continue to learn more about programs, curriculum, and student dynamics as we build our program. Between all of the fundraisers that took place this year we raised over \$100,000 in support of the school! The marathon had a different look this year as we chalked up Library Square by creating colorful faithful designs on the sidewalks. The 2nd Annual Gala was an evening of joy visiting with people and celebrating our school. The funds raised help with items such as our new math program, student Chromebooks, teacher professional development and many other wonderful things. Many thanks to all of you who have contributed through volunteer services and/or monetarily to this success. Our Minnesota Nonpublic School Association Accreditation (MNSAA) accreditation renewal process begins next fall in what we call our "self-study" year. This will be an opportunity for all of us to dive in and discover new initiates that will improve our school community. 2024 Marks the 70th year of St. Anastasia school. We look forward to reminiscing with our alumni soon. There are a lot of exciting things happening at St. Anastasia school and we welcome all to be a part of this amazing community.




